NAHS Dual Enrollment (DE) Program Quick Guide for 2025-26

Dual Enrolment (DE) is a program allowing eligible 11th and 12th grade students to enroll in a local college, take college classes and earn college credit while working on their HS diploma. The State of GA covers the cost of tuition, mandatory fees and required textbooks for up to 30 semester or 45-quarter hours <u>AND</u> only for courses on the state approved GA Futures Dual Enrollment Course Directory. Students may enter the DE program in either the summer or the fall semester.

Students who do not follow ALL the NAHS DE application procedures and deadlines will NOT be eligible to participate in the DE program, even if the college has accepted the student. Students must be approved by their NAHS counselor to participate.

Applying to the College

To apply students need to visit the dual enrollment admissions webpage for the college to which they want to apply. There they will find the college's DE program information, application requirements, and deadlines. Colleges will only review students with a <u>complete</u> application file. A complete college DE application will may include the following:

- College Online DE Application
- GAFutures Dual Enrollment Funding Application
- Official HS transcript (sent via Parchment.com)
- \circ Official SAT, ACT, PSAT, PreACT or ACCUPLACER test scores
- Other Supporting Documents (will vary by the individual college): i.e. Immunization Records, Proof of Residency, etc.

Official SAT, ACT, PSAT and ACCUPLACER Test Scores:

Students must meet the college's minimum DE test score requirement. Some colleges may be test optional for DE. Students are responsible for confirming the college's current test requirements.

- The college classes students must choose classes from the state approved DE course directory on GAFutures
- The courses on the state approved list include core subject classes (English, Math, Science, Social Studies and Foreign language) and some CTAE classes.
- Students should review the approved course offerings for the college(s) they are considering before they apply to ensure the classes they are interested in are approved.
- Approved courses and offerings differ by college. There is no guarantee that classes listed in the directory will be offered by the college every semester.
- All DE class passing grades are weighted 10 points.

Dual Enrollment Schedules

- All dual enrollment candidates will initially be scheduled for a full NAHS class schedule.
- No students will have dual enrollment classes added to their HS schedule until they have been accepted and attend a North Atlanta DE registration and approval session in May.
- Students/Parents are responsible for providing their own transportation to/from the college (exception DE at ACCA or Atlanta Metro State)
- Students are not permitted on the NAHS campus during the school day unless they are here for a NAHS class
